James Meredith becomes the first black student to enroll at the University of Mississippi	1909	Martin Luther King delivers his famous "I Have a Dream" speech
Jackie Robinson breaks Major League Baseball's color barrier when he is signed to the Brooklyn Dodgers by Branch Rickey.	1914	The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) is founded, providing young blacks with a place in the civil rights movement (April).
President Johnson signs the Civil Rights Act, the most sweeping civil rights legislation since Reconstruction. It prohibits discrimination of all kinds based on race, color, religion, or national origin	1947	President Johnson appoints Thurgood Marshall to the Supreme Court. He becomes the first black Supreme Court Justice.
Brown v. Board of Education of Topeka, Kans. declares that racial segregation in schools is unconstitutional (May 17).	1954	Marcus Garvey establishes the Universal Negro Improvement Association, an influential black nationalist organization "to promote the spirit of race pride" and create a sense of worldwide unity among blacks.
Rosa Parks refuses to give up her seat at the front of the "colored section" of a bus to a white passenger	1955	The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People is founded in New York by prominent black and white intellectuals and led by W.E.B. Du Bois.
